## PREFACE

This is the fifth annual issue of "Development Statistics of the Punjab", since 1972. Prior to 1972, Bureau of Statistics published eight issues containing data on West Pakistan basis. The last three of these eight issues included data separately for the four Provinces of the Punjab, Sind, N.W.F. and Baluchistan. "The Development Statistics of the Punjab" contains socio-economic statistical information arranged in twenty two separate sections. Available information has been presented to facilitate ready reference to statistics required for planning and evaluation of development activities.

As compared to the 1975-issue, certain changes have been introduced in this edition. Table on "Distribution of Improved Seed of Wheat & Cotton by Districts" has been deleted, as more current information was not supplied by the Seed Corporation. Less timely data have been eliminated. Tables in respect of monthly average wholesale prices of crops other than Wheat (Mexipak) and Basmati Rice have also been deleted for the same reason. A few new tables have been added for the benefit of the users. These are table nos: 3,4,16, 39, 40, 113 to 116 and 138 to 140. Explanatory Notes have been revised to incorporate necessary changes. Format changes have been introduced to improve the organization of the subject-matter.

In order to make this Bulletin more informative and useful explanatory notes on important sections such as Meteorology, Agriculture (Land Utilization, Acreage and production of agricultural crops), Forestry, Fisheries, Foodgrains, Fuel & Power, Industry, (Current Industrial Statistics, Census of Manufacturing Industries and Census of Small and House-hold Manufacturing Industries), Prices, Education and Health Sections have been added. The explanatory notes describe the scope of information, procedures of collection and compilation of relevant data, definitions of technical terms and statistical concepts and limitations of data presented. In some cases definitions, explanations and limitations of data have been described in the 'foot-notes' of some tables.





The list of contents has been arranged alphabetically for easy reference to the concerned field of interest. The sources of information other than Bureau of Statistics, have been indicated for the respective tables. Statistics which are produced by the Bureau of Statistics, are presented without citation.

Except as other-wise indicated, statistical information presented in this publication relates only to the province of the Punjab. Where it relates to the country as a whole, it has been specifically described in table-title. The breakdown of provincial data by administrative units like Tehsils, Districts and Divisions has also been given in some cases.

The users of the information are requested to communicate their comments and statistical needs for consideration in planning the future editions. The Bureau of Statistics gratefully acknowledges the cooperation extended by source agencies in providing the required information.

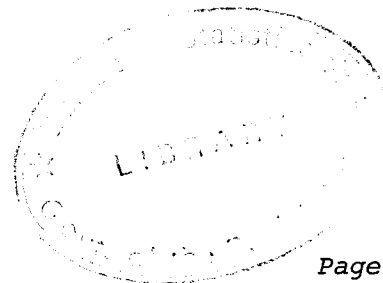

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EXPLANATORY NOTES  
ON  
AGRICULTURE SECTION

METEROLOGY

This section includes yearly rainfall data from 1970 to 1975 and monthly data for 1975 and 1976 (January to June). The rainfall at the specified stations is recorded in millimeters instead of inches and cents (1"=25.4 Millimeters) at 0500, 0800 and 1700 Hrs. PST daily by the Meteorological Observers working in Meteorological Observatories. The Meteorological Observers not only record rainfall but many other Meteorological elements like, Pressure, Temperature (Maximum & Minimum) Dry & Wet bulb, temprature, Humidity, Dew point temp., Horizontal visibility, Clouds, wind (Direction & Velocity) and other important wheather phenomena like Thunder-storm, Lighting, Dust-strom, Hailstorm, Fog, Mist, etc. After recording all the Meteorological data at hours mentioned above in the Daily Pocket Register, the Meteorological transmit telegraphically this data, in coded form, to Meteorological Office, Lahore Airport. The Meteorological Office utilises this data to issue daily weather forecast. This data is also published in the Regional Daily Weather Report which is issued by the Meteorological Office, Lahore Airport.

2. The Meteorological Observations recorded daily at different hours are copied by the Observers in Monthly Meteorological Register and this Register is sent to Regional Centre at 46-Gulberg Road, Lahore in the first week of each succeeding month. These Registers are then thoroughly scrutinized by the trained Meteorological staff at Lahore and necessary corrections are applied, where necessary.

3. The sums and averages and extreme values of all the Meteorological Observations are also worked out by the scrutinizing staff. On the basis of these monthly values over a long period of 30 years the normal values are worked out.

## Agriculture

I. This section includes data for the years 1964-65 to 1975-76 on the following topics :-

1. Canals Withdrawals;
2. Tubewells Installed, Electrified and Pumping in SCARPS Areas, their Pumpage Capacity and Actual Pumpage;
3. Sales, Nutrients per Lb and Prices of Fertilizers;
4. Distribution of Improved Seeds;
5. Procurement of Pesticides and Area Treated with Pesticides;
6. Land Utilization;
7. Cropped Area Irrigated by Different Modes of Irrigation, Total Area Sown under various Crops (Total and Irrigated); Area Failed and
8. Production and Per Acre yield of major crops, Area and Production of various oil seeds, fruits and other minor Crops.

Data for this Section have been collected from various Sources indicated in the Tables.

II. Details about the collection and compilation of data relating to some of the important among the afore-said series are given below :-

- i) Land Utilization: Land Utilization Statistics are compiled by the Statistical Wing of the Agriculture Department. These Statistics are compiled from the information supplied annually by the Deputy Commissioners which is based upon summarisation of crop inspection entered in the Form-I of "Lal Kitab" of the Revenue Department.

Definitions of the terms used in the Land Utilization Statistics are given below :-

1. Current Fallow: Comprises land which was not cultivated during a specified year, but was cultivated for at least one harvest during the preceeding two harvests.

2. Culturable Waste: Comprises the cultivable land left uncultivated for four consecutive harvests.
  3. Area not available for cultivation; includes barren or mountaneous land, area under roads, canals, rivers, sites of villages and houses and all such areas are devoted to use other than agriculture.
  4. Area not reported:Comprises the balance of the geographical area and reported area.
- ii. Area under crops: Census of Crop Acreage is conducted by the Revenue Patwaris, twice a year, one for Kharif Season and other for Rabi Season in 24922 Mauzas of the Punjab Province. The Mauza-wise Crop Acreage Returns (Goshwara Jinswars) prepared manually by the Patwaris, are collected by the Bureau, through 73 Tehsildars. These returns are checked by the Bureau for completeness of coverage, coded and punched. Mauza-wise credibility checking is done with the help of the computer. Errors of coverage, recording and processing the data are thus minimized and the quality of actual Crop Acreages Statistics is improved. These statistics are utilized by the Agriculture Department in the preparation of final production estimates.
- iii. Production of Crops:For Wheat, Cotton, Rice, Maize and Sugarcane, the Agriculture Department conducts Random Crop-Cutting Surveys. The observed data of these Surveys are edited in the light of available data on weather conditions, availability of water, use of fertilizers and other agricultural inputs. The Survey Estimates of yield-rates are then modified and utilized to prepare 'Official' Production Estimates.

For other crops, the yield-rates are estimated on the basis of 'Eye-estimates' of the field staff of both the Revenue and Agriculture Departments. The subjective yield-rates are then applied to estimate the 'Official' estimates of total out-turn of the remaining crops.

### III. Limitations:

- i) Statistics if not available by due time are not useful for administrative and planning purposes, although such statistics may be useful for historical analyses. The timely availability of statistics depends on two factors, firstly, the receipt of reports from the Field Staff and Secondly, their tabulation at the Provincial level. As far as the acreage under all crops is concerned, the Bureau of Statistics has been trying to reduce the time-lag in the collection of Goshwara Jinswars from the Revenue Field Staff and also in minimizing the tabulation time. The Bureau has been successful in reducing the tabulation time appreciably.

- ii) Most of agricultural statistics are by-products of the administrative activities of the Revenue Department. Since the collection of Statistics is not the objective or even a primary aim of the Revenue Department, the system has not provided for quality control on statistics derived from its records. The compilation of figures at all levels is done manually which undoubtedly contains errors of coverage, classifications, summations etc.
- iii) Despite the fact that the Department of Agriculture over the past decade, has been able to place substantial statistical staff in the field, the desired improvement in statistics has not come about because the statistical staff in the field has been under the administrative charge of the Extension Wing which has quite often used them for purposes other than statistical work. Since the primary responsibility of this Wing is agricultural extension, it is not surprising that collateral extension duties assigned to statistical staff have often been given higher priority than statistical duties. This has seriously jeopardised the conduct of acreage and yield surveys.

IV. Kharif Crops season and Rabi Crops season run respectively from April to September and October to March.

V. Canal Withdrawals Data:

For reporting Canal withdrawals data the canals have been grouped together as under :-

EXPLANATORY NOTESONEDUCATION SECTION

This Section includes annual data for the eight years 1964-65 to 1973-74 supplied by the Bureau of Education on the following topics:-

- (1) Number, Enrolment and Teaching Staff of Schools (Primary, Middle, High and Normal), Colleges (Inter, Degree and Professional), Universities (Punjab, Engineering and Agriculture) and Technical Institutes (Polytechnics, Vocational Schools and Commercial Institutes).
- (2) Enrolment at Various Levels of Education by Grades.
- (3) Number of successful candidates of various Universities of the Punjab.

There are five Directorates of Education; one for each of the Divisions of Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Lahore, Multan and Bahawalpur. Each of these Directorates have their Statistical Cells. Basic data of Schools are supplied by individual Institution to the respective District Education Officers, who tabulate these data and supply them to the Divisional Statistical Cells who, in turn, supply the same to the Bureau of Education, Lahore. Data for the Schools situated in the Federal Capital Area, Islamabad are collected by the Education Bureau through the Central Bureau of Education of the Pakistan Government, but are being reported separately from 1971-72 onwards.

The colleges and Universities supply their data direct to the Bureau of Education, Lahore.

Board of Technical Education collects data from the Technical Institutions (Polytechnics, Commercial Institutes and Vocational Schools), which are under its administrative control. Data for these institutions are compiled by the Directorate of Technical Education and transmitted to the Education Bureau.

Definitions of the various types of institutions are given below:-

- (1) Primary School is an Institution comprising First to Five (I-V) Grades of Educational System.
- (2) Middle School is an Institution comprising First to Eight (I-VIII) Grades of Educational System.
- (3) High School is an Institution comprising First to Ten (I-X) Grades.
- (4) Intermediate College is an Institution comprising of Two (XI and XII) Grades.
- (5) Degree College is an Institution comprising Four (XI to XIV) Grades.

EXPLANATORY NOTESONFISHERIES

The Statistical table contains data on fish production (Quantity & Value) during the year, 1964-65 to 1975-76. This data has been compiled on the basis of fish catches/Marketing recorded by the field staff of Fisheries Department in various districts of the Province. The annual price of commodity is calculated by taking the average of minimum and maximum transactions of different lots of fish in each month.

LIMITATIONS

There are a number of Limitations experienced in the collection and compilation of wholesale prices of fish, viz.

1. The commodity is not graded as it is perishable item. The fish is exposed for sale by Arhtis in different lots according to weight and freshness of catches, irrespective of various species. It is, therefore, not possible to assess the species-wise prices. The specimen with better individual weight and having comparatively better freshness normally fetch more price. There is often variation in the wholesale price of different lots in the same market.
2. There is no marketing act to regulate the sale of fish in the market.
3. The conceptual basis of price is not uniform in different markets of the Province.
4. The staff responsible for collection of prices are not statistics-oriented and, therefore, the quality of prices supplied is mostly under-rated.

STEPS FOR IMPROVEMENT

The infra-structural organization of the department is being suitably strengthened to ensure authentic collection of statistical data. Special orientation courses are also likely to be organized in the Fisheries Training Centre for the inservice personnel to acquaint with the necessary technical-know-how in relation to collection of Statistical data.

EXPLANATORY NOTES  
ON  
FOODGRAINS STATISTICS SECTION

This Section includes data on the following topics :-

1. Procurement of Wheat by the Government on Voluntary basis.
2. Arrival of Wheat in Mandies.
3. Releases of Wheat from Provincial Reserves.
4. Stock position of Wheat in Provincial Reserves.
5. Available Foodgrains Storage capacity.

These data are supplied by the District Offices of the Food Department on the basis of records maintained by them. Wheat offered voluntarily by growers, zamindars, traders, agents etc., is purchased at the procurement Price fixed by the Government at the Procurement Centres established by the Food Department for the purpose.

Releases of Wheat from Government reserves mainly relate to the Wheat issued to Roller Flour Mills for grinding and sale to consumers through Ration Depots, at fixed prices, to supplement the supplies of Wheat flour available in the open market. These stocks of Wheat are issued as a measure to stabilize open market prices of Wheat and Wheat atta.

Stock position of Wheat on the 1st of every month indicates the size of buffer stocks maintained by the Government as a lever against rise in prices of Wheat and Wheat Atta in the market.

The Wheat crop year runs from May to April

EXPLANATORY NOTES  
ON  
FOREST STATISTICS SECTION

The Statistical tables included in this Section contain the designated forest areas by legal status and the outturn & value of timber and firewood in the Punjab.

I. DESIGNATED FOREST AREAS

These include all the wooded and non-wooded areas and the barren lands which are under the administrative control of the Punjab Forest Department for the afforestation and management purposes. It includes all the coniferous forests, scrub forests, riverian forests, irrigated plantations, linear plantations and range lands.

The brief definitions of the categories of the Forest areas by legal status are :-

(i) RESERVED FORESTS

The forest area under the control of the Forest Department declared as reserved forest under the Forest Act 1927. The rights and privileges are normally limited and settled.

(ii) PROTECTED FORESTS

The forest area under the control of Forest Department which has been declared as protected Forest under the Provision of Forest Act 1927.

(iii) UNCLASSIFIED FORESTS

The Government Forests which are neither Reserved Forest nor Protected Forests.

(iv) SECTION-38 AREA

Private land area handed over voluntarily by the owners to the Forest Department for management under Section-38 of Forest Act, 1927.

(v) CHOS ACT AREA

Lands taken up for soil and water conservation under the Chos Act.

(vi) RESUMED LANDS

Lands taken over by Government under various Reforms or Martial Law Regulations.

(vii) GUZARA FOREST

The Forest area which are the joint property of the villagers and are being managed presently by the Forest Department.

II. PRODUCTION AND VALUE OF TIMBER & FIREWOOD

The information about the production & value of timber & firewood relates to Forest Department managed forests.

EXPLANATORY NOTES  
ON  
ELECTRICITY CONSUMERS STATISTICAL DATA

Tables 91 & 92 given in this Section contain Statistics of number of consumers, Units sold and revenue assessed respectively pertaining to the years 1964-65 to 1975-76.

2. The Statistics are compiled by the Statistical Cell of the Office of the Chief Accountant (Power) from the basic data supplied montly by the Revenue Officers for each station on prescribed Form.

3. Before the figures contained in the returns are posted in ledgers and compiled, statistical examination of reported data is performed by the Statistical Cell to verify their correctness and also to determiné the average cost per unit under each category of tariff. The data supplied by all Revenue Officers (46 in number) for 255 stations is then compiled tariff-wise every month. At the end of the year, data of 12 months is further consolidated in various tabular forms and produced in a booklet form showing No. of consumers, Units Generated and sold, Revenue assessed and realised and outstanding arrears Region-wise and Province-wise.

4. Details about the collection and Processing of the data by the Revenue Officers before its submission to the office of the Chief Accountant (P) are given below :-

- i) Forwarding lists (meter reading lists) are sent by the Sub Divisional Offices to the Revenue Offices for issuance of bills to the consumers.
  - ii) Both meter reading and billing to all the consumers falling in its jurisdiction is done by each S.D.O./ Revenue Office according to the scheduled programme and the whole process is completed during the month.
  - iii) After that consumers ledgers are closed by each Revenue Office for preparation for billing for the next month. Information from each ledger is transferred to Abstract ledgers of Revenue Offices. The consolidated figures are
-

then posted in the prescribed form (E-I) and sent to the Office.

5. Definitions of various categories of consumers are as follows :-

i) General Supply for Domestic Purposes

General Supply for Domestic Purposes means a supply for Lamps, Fans and other single phase appliances installed in residences, Hospitals, Dispensaries, Places of worship and approved religious educational and charitable institutions.

ii) General Supply for Commercial Purposes

General Supply for Commercial Purposes means a supply for Lamps, Fans and other single phase appliances, installed in Government and Semi-Government Offices and Institutions, Commercial Offices and Commercial Establishments, such as shops, Hotels, Restaurants and Places of entertainment like, Cinemas, Theatres and Clubs etc.

iii) Industrial Supply

Industrial supply means a supply for bonafide industrial purposes in Factories and also for Water Pumps and Tube-wells operating on 3-phase 400 volts, other than those meant for the Irrigation or Reclamation of Agricultural Land.

iv) Agricultural Supply

Agricultural supply means supply for bonafide Agricultural Tube-wells and Lift Irrigation Pumps for the Irrigation and Agricultural Land and Reclamation and Drainage Scheme Tube-wells.

v) Public Lighting Supply

Public Lighting Supply means a supply given to the Local Bodies charged with the Public Lighting, for the purpose of illuminating Public Lamps within the Area of its jurisdiction.

vi) Bulk Supply

Bulk Supply means a supply given at one point to Licensee, a non-Licensee and other Government and Semi-Government and approved Institutions having their own distribution facilities.

The Definitions of Principal Hydro, Small Hydro, Thermal, Gas and Diesel type of electricity are as follows:-

1. Principal Hydro:

The power stations utilising water heads available at the Dams come under principal Hydro. The prime movers of the generator are run by discharging water through water turbines.

2. Small Hydro:

The power stations utilizing water heads available from the small Dams across canals come under small Hydro. The prime movers of the generators are run by discharging water through water turbines.

3. Thermal:

Thermal Stations are based on steam turbines utilizing steam raised in boilers using Sui Gas as a fuel in the Boilers.

4. Gas:

Unlike the conventional thermal stations, natural (Sui) Gas is burnt and this expanded directly in the gas turbine which is prime mover for the generator.

5. Diesel:

Conventional Diesel engines using high speed diesel oil are used as prime movers for the generators.

2. Number of Patients Treated in Hospitals, Dispensaries and Rural Health Centres -- Total Institutions and Patients Treated in Hospitals by Management Classification.

The Hospitals and dispensaries in the Province are required to keep statistics of all the outdoor and patients in the 'Abstract Register'. From the information recorded in the 'Abstract Register' and other relevant registers the hospitals/dispensaries are required to supply annual statistical return to the District Health Offices. The information supplied relates to number of patients treated from different diseases, number and types of operations performed etc. The District Health Officers are to submit the consolidated returns to the Divisional Health Directorates where the information is tabulated at the Divisional level and sent to the Provincial Health Directorate for consolidation at Provincial level.

On 1st January 1976, there were 1538 Health Institutions, \* 201 Hospitals, 1171 Dispensaries, 113 Rural Health Centres and 53 T.B. Clinics ) in the Province. The Statistics are tabulated manually at various levels and detailed analysis of statistics is, therefore, not possible.

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\* These institutions partly cover the institutions run by Auqaf Departement and Social Security Scheme. But these institutions do not include institutions run by Jail Department, Railways, Central Government, Defence Services and Private Doctors.

EXPLANATORY NOTES  
ON  
INDUSTRIAL SECTION

Section on Industries includes industrial statistics based on the following statistical enquiries:-

- i) Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment.
- ii) Annual Census of Manufacturing Industries (CMI)
- iii) Ad-hoc Census of Small and Household Manufacturing Industries (CSHMI): 1975.

It may be observed here that for the purposes of CSHMI, a small/household establishment was defined as:-

"An establishment located in urban area of the Punjab Province which was engaged in manufacturing activity and had an investment in fixed assets (excluding land) of an amount not exceeding Rs.20 Lacs."

Because of this definition, some registered units covered under annual Census of Manufacturing Industries were also covered under CSHMI. These registered manufacturing units mainly belonged to "Processing of Agricultural Produce, including all Food & Feed Industries - Cotton Ginning Factories", "Textiles - Cotton Cloth Weaving (Power looms)" and "Engineering Industries - Electric Fans & Diesel Engines."

In order to compute aggregates of summary statistics of the manufacturing sector (Large and small) further tabulation of CSHMI data segregating information relating to registered manufacturing units and un-registered manufacturing units will be required.

## Industrial Production and Employment

Statistical tables included in this section contain data on Production and Employment for the years 1970-71 to 1975-76 in respect of 43 products manufactured by 23 selected large scale Industries in the Punjab. These Industries accounted for about 73% of "Total Value Added" in manufacturing sector in the Province during 1970-71

This information has been collected through Bureau's Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment which was started in October, 1971. Industry-wise proformas are used for the purpose. Data from non-responding factories is collected by Bureau's officials through personal visits. The results of the Survey for a month are generally received by 25th of the following month.

Coverage is complete in respect of Cotton Yarn, woollen and Worsted Cloth, Vegetable Ghee, Sugar, Cigarettes, Cement, Caustic Soda, Soda Ash, Acid, Chemical Fertilizers, Paper and Paper Board, Bicycles, Transformers, Electric Meters, Switch Gears, Soft Drinks, Jute Textiles and Petroleum Products. Coverage for the remaining manufactured products is specified below:-

1. Cotton Cloth:- It covers 25 weaving units having 50 or more looms. The Production of these units was 99.3% of the total production of Cloth in Registered Factories which reported in census of Manufacturing Industries: 1968-69.
2. Woollen Yarn, Knitting Weel and Blankets:- It excludes a few small units.
3. Footwear:- 14 large factories including Bata, Service, Basco and Raja Industries are being covered. Production of these factories was about 98% of Footwear Production in registered Units of the Province.

4. Electric Fans:- All large and medium size factories are covered.
5. Electric Motors:- All known large and medium size factories are covered.
6. Steel Rerolling:- According to Bureau's establishment survey of Steel Rerolling Industry for the year 1975-76, about 90% of the production are being covered in the survey.
7. Diesel Engines:- Production and Employment pertains to 22 factories whose production is about 70% of the total production of Diesel Engines.
8. Leather Tanning:- All large Tanneries are covered.
9. Paints and Varnishes:- All large and medium size factories are covered.
10. Cycle Tyres and Tubes:- All Large units are covered.

Steps for Improvement:- To complete coverage in respect of footwear, Electric Motors, Steel Re-rolling and Diesel Engines Industries, efforts are being made to ensure response from outstanding Factories.

Efforts are made to keep the list of factories upto-date in consultation with Central Board of Revenue, PICIC, ADB<sup>P</sup> and Directorate of Labour Welfare, Punjab.

Scope of the monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment is being extended to more Industries.

## Annual Census of Manufacturing Industries (CMI)

This section contains tables on Summary Statistics (Fixed Assets, Employment, Industrial cost, Value of Production and Gross Value Added) of registered factories reporting for the annual Census of Manufacturing Industries for the Year 1964-65 to 1973-74. This Census is conducted under Industrial Statistics Act 1942, under a co-operative programme shared by Statistics Division, Government of Pakistan; Directorate of Industries and Mineral Development, Punjab and Bureau of Statistics, Punjab with the following distribution of work:-

### Statistics Division

- a) Planning of Census
- b) Preparation of Questionnaire, Tabulation Plan and Editing Instructions, in consultation with all concerned Federal Industries, Provincial Departments and Autonomous & Private Organizations.
- c) Preparation and Publication of CMI tables on national level
- d) Maintenance of an upto-date list of manufacturing Establishments.

### Directorate of Industries and Mineral Development, Punjab.

- a) Notification of the questionnaires.
- b) Printing and Mailing out of questionnaires.
- c) Collection of CMI returns
- d) Preliminary editing of CMI returns.

### Bureau of Statistics, Punjab.

- a) Statistical examination and computer processing of Census Returns.
- b) Conducting of Non-response Survey for estimation of data for the establishments not reporting for the Census.
- c) Publication of Provincial Census Results.

Scope & Coverage

All factories, carrying on manufacturing or repairing activities and registered under the Factories Act 1934, are covered under the Census. It, however, excludes Defence and other Govt. establishments including Railway Workshops which provide ancilliary facilities, and do not manufacture or repair anything for commercial purpose.

Definitions

Important terms used in the Section are defined as Under:-

## i) REGISTERED FACTORIES

An establishment is said to be registered under Factories Act 1934, if ten or more workers are working on any day of the preceding twelve months and in any part of which manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on, but does not include mine subject to the operation of Mines Act 1923.

## ii) GROSS VALUE OF FIXED ASSETS

It includes the gross value of land, building, machinery and other fixed assets i.e. equipment, vehicles, furniture etc. as at the end of the year.

## iii) EMPLOYMENT

It is the total average daily employment computed from the quarterly/monthly employment data reported in CMI returns adjusted for contract labour.

## iv) EMPLOYMENT COST

It includes wages and salaries, each and non-cash benefits and the amount paid to contract labour.

## v) INDUSTRIAL COST

It includes cost of raw materials, fuel and electricity and payments to others for work done and for repair and maintenance of the equipment.

## vi) GROSS VALUE OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

It includes value of products and by products, Sale-proceeds from industrial waste, receipts for industrial work done for services rendered to others, sale of electricity and value of 'net work in process'. The value of products and by product includes indirect taxes.

## vii) GROSS VALUE ADDED

This is worked out by subtracting industrial cost from the gross value of industrial production.

Limitations of CMI

1. The mailing list used for the census may not be upto date.
2. The reported data contained reporting errors and inconsistencies, which were corrected on the basis of available supplementary information or/and past data.
3. Census results become available with a time-lag of 2-3 years due to the time taken for collection, editing and tabulation processes.
4. Size and nature of non-response varies from year to year. Since non-response survey could not be conducted and Census results were not adjusted for non-response, they may not be comparable from year to year.

The Bureau of Statistics have, during recent years, taken the following steps to improve the Census Results:-

1. List of registered factories is being kept upto date.
2. Reported data is subjected to manual as well as computer statistical editing, before final tabulation. Missing information is estimated.
3. Prior to 1971-72, no information was available to provide a check on reported census information. A Current Industrial Statistics Survey was started in 1971, under which monthly summary data on some aspects of manufacturers activity of important industries is collected. This data which has been shown under Section on Current Industrial Statistics is also referred to during editing of CMI returns.
4. Efforts are being made to complete editing and tabulation as early as possible, after collection of returns by Directorate of Industries & Mineral Development, Punjab.



## Small and Household Manufacturing Industries

Statistical tables included in this section present some summary statistics extracted from the Census Report: 1975-76 on "Basic Statistics on Small and Household Manufacturing Industries", issued by the Punjab Small Industries Corporation, Lahore.

This Census Report provides information about investment on fixed assets, employment and employment cost, Value of raw material, fuel and electricity consumed, value of products and by-products, amount of indirect taxes, 'Value added' and various 'Capacities'. The Census covered small and household manufacturing units located in urban areas of the Punjab Province (Excluding military restricted areas) engaged in manufacturing activity and having investment in fixed assets (excluding land) of the value not exceeding Rs.20 Lacs. Repair shops of cycles, watches, televisions, automobiles and such other goods of domestic use were not covered in the Census, but the establishments engaged in repair of products like plant and machinery were covered. Bakeries attached with hotels and restaurants; pharmacies run by physicians as a part of their clinics and the teeth repair/manufacturing shops were not covered.

The field enumeration work for this Census was started in March, 1975 and was accomplished in 10 months' time. The statistics were collected for the last calendar month ending prior to the date of filling of the questionnaire.

### LIMITATIONS OF DATA

1. The extent of under-coverage has not been estimated through post-census evaluation survey and the statistical information tabulated had not been adjusted accordingly.
2. Recent extensions in the boundary limits of the cities and towns were not taken into account. Almost 30% of the city/town maps used during the census operations were outdated.
3. Majority of small industrialists and household manufacturers do not maintain proper Books of Accounts. The reported data were, therefore, based either on the rough estimates provided by the respondents or the 'assessment' of the Census staff.
4. Investment criterion used to define a Small/Household Establishment has resulted in enumeration of registered units as well. It may be noted that 1527 or 3.9% of the total number of 39033 manufacturing units surveyed were registered manufacturing units. This has introduced an element of duplication in the coverage of two industrial statistics enquiries, viz.
  - i) Census of Manufacturing Industries (CMI)-covering registered factories only.
  - ii) Census of Small and Household Manufacturing Industries (CSHMI): 1975 - covering both the registered and un-registered manufacturing units.

The duplication in coverage was mainly encountered in the following major groups of industries :-

Even though the number of registered units is relatively small yet the value added contributed by these units was substantial. For example in the "Processing of Agricultural Produce, including all food & feed Industries" group, out of 6355 manufacturing units surveyed, 217 were registered Cotton Ginning Factories. These factories contributed a value added of Rs. 30263 thousands or 56.5% of Rs. 53522 thousands - the total value added by the group.

Separate tabulations in respect of manufacturing units registered under Factories Act will have to be obtained from basic census records before aggregates of summary statistics about manufacturing sector (Large & Small) can be worked out.

## PRICE SECTION

This section includes data on the following topics:-

- (1) Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices of Selected Articles, Pakistan.
- (2) Index Number of Wholesale Prices by Groups, Pakistan.
- (3) Wholesale Prices of Major Agricultural Commodities and Livestock Products in Important Markets, Punjab.
- (4) Combined Consumer Price Index Number (General) for Industrial, Commercial and Government Employees, Pakistan.
- (5) Spot Bullion quotations at Lahore.

Sources of data for these series have been indicated for each Table. For (1), (2), (4) and (5), it is Statistics Division, Karachi & for (3), the Directorate of Agriculture Economics and Marketing, Government of the Punjab, Lahore.

New Series of consumer Price Index Numbers with 1969-70=100 as price base and weight base, 1972 have been introduced. The old series with 1961=100 & weight base 1955-56 stand disbanded after December, 1973. Accordingly the table relating to Consumer Prices Index (General) for clerical Wage Earners & Industrial Workers, Lahore has been eliminated and table of combined Consumer Price Index Numbers (General) for Industrial, Commercial and Government Employees, Pakistan (1969-70=100) has been added.

Technical details about collection and compilation of data pertaining to Monthly Average Wholesale Prices of Major Agricultural Commodities and Livestock Products by Directorate of Agriculture Economics and Marketing, Lahore, are given below:-

(i) Coverage:- There are one hundred and fourteen regulated markets functioning in the Punjab, but information regarding Wholesale Prices is obtained from only 24 important markets of Various districts. About 125 items have, so far, been taken up for the collection of price data.

In this Bulletin, however, data for five most important Markets are being published.

(ii) Source:- The Market Committees record daily minimum and maximum Wholesale rates, based on actual transactions. These data pertain to all important agricultural commodities and Livestock products and are recorded on a prescribed Form. These Forms are sent to the Extra Assistant Director of Agriculture (Economics and Marketing) who makes necessary scrutiny of the data and prepares a Weekly Statement at the District level. These statements are finally processed at the Provincial Headquarters.

(iii) Methodology:- The weekly and Monthly average wholesale prices have been worked out as Simple Arithmetic Means. The number of observations taken up for the calculation of weekly average generally are 4-6 and for monthly average 20-25, depending upon the number of days the actual transaction in the respective market occurred. Each month has been divided into four week and weekly average was calculated accordingly to the following schedule of data:-

Ist week	...	1st to 7th
2nd week	..	8th to 14th
3rd week	..	15th to 22nd
4th	..	23rd to 30th

(a) Calculation of Daily Average Price:- The Daily Average Price of a commodity is calculated by taking the average of the Minimum and Maximum Prices on each day of the week.

Example I

Minimum	= Rs. 17.00
Maximum	= Rs. 17.50
Average	= $\frac{\text{Rs. 17.00} + \text{Rs. 17.50}}{2}$ = Rs.17.25

(b) Calculation of Weekly Average Price:- Weekly Average Price is the Arithmetic Mean of the daily average.

(iv) Limitations:- There are a number of Limitations in collection and compilation of Wholesale Prices of Agricultural Commodities and Livestock Products; Some of these are given below:-

- (1) The agricultural items are not graded, except in case of exportable items like cotton. This causes a problem in watching the prices of the different qualities of any commodity in the same market and the prices of the same specifications and grades of any commodity over a period of time.
- (2) The average wholesale prices are calculated as simple arithmetic means. Weighing of the price data is not possible due to lack of information of quantities sold.
- (3) The conceptual basis of prices is not uniform in different markets of the Province.
- (4) The staff responsible for collection of prices needs training in Statistical methods for data collection to further improve the quality of prices.
- (5) Coverage of the number of markets is small, because of lack of resources.
