REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS OF THE MANAGEMENT COMPANY

The Board of Directors of Arif Habib Investment Management Limited (AHIML), the Management Company of Pakistan Stock Market Fund (PSM) is pleased to present the annual report together with audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2005.

Financial Performance

As at 30 June 2005 Net Assets under management increased to Rs. 2,712.98 million, as compared to Rs. 1,051.64 million as at 30 June 2004. Major constituents of increase in net assets were net income before distribution of Rs. 1,171.64 million during the year along with generation of Rs. 257.91 million from issue of new units during the year, coupled with an increase of Rs. 132.44 million in the value of 'available for sale' portfolio of investments.

The net income before distribution for the financial year 2004-05 was Rs. 1,171.64 million, as against Rs. 382.103 million for the corresponding year. Major constituents of the income are realised capital gain of Rs. 508.94 million, dividend income of Rs. 64.97 million and income from COT of Rs. 29.14 million.

Income Distribution

The Board has approved a final bonus dividend at Rs. 25 per unit i.e. 50%. The Fund had already distributed an interim cash dividend of Rs. 10 per unit i.e. 20%. This makes a total of Rs. 35 per unit i.e. 70% for the financial year 2004-05

Investing Activities

The Fund was actively managed during the year, always taking care to protect the NAV of our investors. On occasions over the year, the PSM reduced exposure to around 55% of net assets where we felt it necessary to preserve the NAV for our investors, and re-entered when we felt it was appropriate.

As at 30 June 2005, PSM's investments as a share of total assets were as follows: 65% shares, 35% cash and near cash (COTs). PSM investment decisions were based purely on fundamentals and investments were according to market opportunities presented over the year. Sector weightage was adjusted accordingly throughout the year given changing company and sector fundamentals.

Market Performance

The market's strong performance in financial year 2004-05 was a response to the improved stock market fundamentals, higher earnings growth, better than expected corporate results and announcements and superior earnings outlook going forward. The market rose 41% during the year and despite the sharp correction in March, still closed appreciably up by 20% over 31 December 2004. The Pakistan Stock Market Fund delivered a total return of 52%, beating the KSE 100 Index by a wide margin of 11%, after all fees and charges.

PSM's Superior Downside Protection

Over the year, the market's volatility (standard deviation) was 1.75% while the PSM's volatility was much lower, i.e. only 1.2%. To give an idea of the PSM's consistency of performance, the PSM fell by a lesser degree than the market, on 92 out of 104 days the market fell – an out-performance rate of 88%, which means that the value of the investor's investment is protected. On most occasions, the PSM's NAV has not fallen by as much as the market declined on any one day.

Advantage of Investing in the PSM rather than Directly in the Market

If one invests directly in shares in a volatile market, there is a greater chance of entering into stocks at too high a level or selling (when cash is required) when prices are down – which means there is greater risk of mistiming your investment. In a mutual fund like the PSM that is less volatile than the market and more stable, there is a lower risk of buying high and selling at a low price.

Growth and Value Portfolio

We have however, made investments for the Fund on fundamentals. Investment style has been picking both growth and value stocks, focusing on high and growing ROEs, earnings growth and stable cash flows. The emphasis has been on business models that can withstand seasonal and cyclical changes in their sectors and demonstrate a defensive quality of earnings. The focus was on building a quality portfolio that can withstand the short-term volatility in the market and deliver higher earnings growth than the overall market. Major sector-wise weightages as a share of net assets were as follows: banks 21%, oil and gas exploration 17%, fertilizer 10%, textiles 10%, refinery 9% and paper and board 5%.

Corporate Governance

The Fund being listed on the Karachi Stock Exchange, the Management Company is committed to observe Code of Corporate Governance prescribed for listed companies. The financial statements, prepared by the Management Company present fairly the state of affairs of the Fund and results of its operations, cash flows and movement in unit holders' fund. Proper books of account of the Fund have been maintained and appropriate accounting policies have been consistently applied in preparation of accounts. International Accounting Standards as applicable in Pakistan have been followed. The system of internal control is sound in design and has been effectively implemented and monitored in the preparation of financial statements. There is no doubt upon Fund's ability to continue as going concern. There has been no material departure from the best practices of Corporate Governance, as detailed in the listing regulations. Key financial data is summarized in note 20 of the financial statements. Outstanding statutory payments on account of taxes, duties, levies and charges, if any have been fully disclosed in the accounts. The statement as to the value of investments of provident fund is not applicable in the case of the Fund as such expenses are borne by the Management Company. The detailed pattern of unit holding, as required by the Companies Ordinance 1984 and the Code of Corporate Governance is enclosed.

Future Outlook

We are positive on the earnings outlook for the stock market over the next twelve months. Earnings growth is expected to be sustainable for the major market drivers and key sectors are expected to deliver earnings growth higher than GDP growth. However, till an alternative efficient source of funding for market participants is not in place, the market is expected to be range-bound. The transition from COT to Margin Finance will still take some time, as system and technical issues are sorted out. Fundamentally speaking, the upward pressure on interest rates continues due to fears of rising inflation with even higher oil prices and the possibility of higher food inflation with the potential adverse impact of the recent floods and rains on essential food supplies. The positive side of the high oil price issue is that as much as 38% of market capitalization consists of oil and energy related stocks, where earnings growth is expected to be in excess of 15% that bodes well for their price appreciation potential. Privatisation too, is expected to be a strong theme for the market in the near future, which is expected to provide an impetus to the market.

Acknowledgement

The Board is thankful to the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan, State Bank of Pakistan, the Trustee to the Fund, Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited, the management of Karachi Stock Exchange for their continued cooperation and support. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE CODE OF CORPORATE GOVERNANCE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

This statement is being presented by the Board of Directors of Arif Habib Investment Management Limited (Company), the Management Company of the Pakistan Stock Market Fund (Fund) to comply with the Code of Corporate Governance contained in Regulation No. 37, of listing regulations of Karachi Stock Exchange for the purpose of establishing a framework of good governance, whereby a listed company is managed in compliance with the best practices of corporate governance.

The Company has applied the principles contained in the Code in the following manner:

- 1. The Company encourages representation of independent non-executive directors and directors representing minority interests on its Board of Directors. At present the Board includes seven non-executive directors, and one director representing minority share holders.
- 2. The directors have confirmed that none of them is serving as a director in more than ten listed companies, including this Company.
- 3. All the resident directors of the Company are registered as taxpayers and none of them has defaulted in payment of any loan to a banking company, a DFI or an NBFI or, being a member of a stock exchange, has been declared as a defaulter by that stock exchange.
- 4. No casual vacancy has occurred in the Board during the year.
- 5. The Company has prepared a 'Statement of Ethics and Business Practices', which has been approved by the Board of directors and employees of the company.
- 6. The Board has developed mission statement and significant policies of the Fund. A complete record of particulars of significant policies along with the dates on which they were approved or amended has been maintained.
- 7. All the powers of the Board have been duly exercised and decisions on material transactions, including appointment and determination of remuneration and terms and conditions of employment of the CEO has been taken by the Board. There is no other executive director of the company besides the CEO.
- 8. The meetings of the Board were presided over by the Chairman and, in his absence, by a director elected by the Board for this purpose and the Board met at least once in every quarter. Written notices of the Board meetings, along with agenda and working papers, were circulated at least seven days before the meeting. The minutes of the meetings were appropriately recorded and circulated.
- 9. The Board arranged an orientation course for its new director during the year to apprise him of his duties and responsibilities.
- 10. The roles and responsibilities of the Chairman and Chief Executive have been approved by the Board of Directors.
- 11. The directors' report for this year has been prepared in compliance with the requirements of the Code and fully describes the salient matters required to be disclosed.
- 12. The directors, CEO and executives do not hold any interest in the units of the Fund other than that disclosed in the pattern of unit holding.
- 13. The financial statements of the Fund were duly endorsed by CEO and CFO of the Company before approval of the Board.
- 14. The Company has complied with all the significant corporate and financial reporting requirements of the Code.

- 15. The Board has formed an audit committee. It comprises four members, all of whom are non-executive directors including the chairman of the committee.
- 16. The meetings of the audit committee were held at least once every quarter prior to approval of the interim and final results of the Fund as required by the Code. The terms of reference of the committee have been formed and advised to the committee for compliance.
- 17. There exists an effective internal audit function within the Company.
- 18. The statutory auditors of the Fund have confirmed that they have been given a satisfactory rating under the quality control review program of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan, that they or any of the partners of the firm, their spouses and minor children do not hold units of the Fund and that the firm and all its partners are in compliance with International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) guidelines on code of ethics as adopted by Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan.
- 19. The statutory auditors or the persons associated with them have not been appointed to provide other services except in accordance with the listing regulations and the auditors have confirmed that they have observed IFAC guidelines in this regard.
- 20. We confirm that all other material principles contained in the Code have been complied with.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

The Pakistan Stock Market Fund (PSM) was established under a Trust Deed executed between Arif Habib Investment Management Limited (AHIML) as Management Company and Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited (CDC) as Trustee. The Trust Deed was executed on 23 October 2001 and was approved by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) on 28 February 2002 in accordance with the Asset Management Companies Rules, 1995 (AMC Rules) [repealed by Non-Banking Finance Companies (Establishment and Regulation) Rules, 2003 (NBFC Rules 2003)].

The Management Company of the Fund has been licensed to act as an Asset Management Company under the NBFC Rules 2003 through a certificate of registration issued by the SECP.

PSM is an open-ended mutual fund, listed on the Karachi Stock Exchange. Units are offered for public subscription on a continuous basis. The units are transferable and can be redeemed by surrendering them to the Fund.

The Fund is a stock market fund, which primarily invests in shares of listed companies and enters into Carry Over Transaction in listed securities.

BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan and the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules and directives issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP). Approved accounting standards comprise of such International Accounting Standards (IAS) as notified under the provisions of the Companies Ordinance, 1984. Wherever, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules or directives issued by the SECP differ with the requirements of these standards, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules and the said directives take precedence.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except that certain financial assets have been included at fair value.

3.2 Investments

All purchases and sales of securities that require delivery within the time frame established by regulation or market convention such as 'T+3' purchases and sales are recognised at the trade date. Trade date is the date on which the Fund commits to purchase or sale the asset.

The management determines the appropriate classification of the investments made by the Fund in accordance with the requirements of International Accounting Standard (IAS) 39; Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement', at the time of purchase and re-evaluates this classification on a regular basis. Investments are categorised as follows:

Available for sale

Investments intended to be held for an indefinite period of time, which may be sold in response to needs for liquidity or changes in equity prices, are classified as 'Available for sale'. Subsequent to initial measurement, 'Available for sale' investments are re-measured to fair value based on the closing quoted market rates ruling at the day-end. Net gains and losses arising on changes in fair values of these investments are taken to equity as part of Unit holders' Funds. When the securities are disposed of or impaired, the related fair value adjustments previously taken to equity are transferred to the Income Statement.

Held for trading

Investments that are acquired principally for the purpose of generating a profit from short-term fluctuations in prices are classified as 'Held for trading'. These investments are marked to market, using the closing market rates at the end of each day and are carried on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities at fair value. Net gains and losses arising on changes in fair values of these investments are taken to the Income Statement.

3.3 Derivatives

Derivative instruments held by the Fund generally comprise of futures contracts in the capital market. These are initially recognised at cost and are subsequently remeasured at their fair value. The fair value of futures contracts is calculated as being the net difference between the contract price and the closing price reported on the primary exchange of the futures contracts. Derivatives with positive market values (unrealised gains) are included in other assets and derivatives with negative market values (unrealised losses) are included in other liabilities in the statement of assets and liabilities. The resultant gains and losses are included in the income statement.

Derivative financial instruments entered into by the Fund do not meet the hedging criteria as defined by International Accounting Standard - 39, Recognition and Measurement of Financial Instruments (IAS - 39), consequently hedge accounting is not used by the Fund.

3.4 Securities under Repurchase/ Resale Agreements

Securities purchased under an agreement to resell (reverse repo) are included as receivable at the fair value of the consideration given. Securities sold, subject to a repurchase agreement (repo) are retained in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities as investments and the counterparty liability is included as payable. All these transactions are accounted for on the settlement date. The difference between the purchase and sale price is treated as income/(expense) in the Income Statement and is recognised over the term of the transactions.

3.5 Issue and Redemption of Units

Units issued are recorded at the offer price, determined by the Management Company for the applications received by the distributors during business hours on that date. The offer price represents the net asset value per unit as of the close of the business day plus the allowable sales load, provision for transaction costs and any provision for duties and charges, if applicable. The sales load is payable to the investment facilitators, distributors and the Management Company. Transaction costs are recorded as the income of the Fund.

Units redeemed are recorded at the redemption price, applicable to units for which the distributors receive redemption applications during business hours of that day. The redemption price represents the net asset value per unit as of the close of the business day less any back-end load, any duties, taxes, charges on redemption and any provision for transaction costs, if applicable.

3.6 Element of Income / (loss) and Capital Gains / (losses) included in Prices of Units Sold less those in Units Repurchased

An equalisation account called the 'element of income / (loss) and capital gains / (losses) included in prices of units sold less those in units repurchased' is created, in order to prevent the dilution of per unit income and distribution of income already paid out on redemption.

The Fund records the net element of accrued income/(loss) and realised capital gains/(losses) relating to units issued and redeemed during an accounting period in the Income Statement while the portion of the element of income/(loss) and capital gains/(losses) that relates to unrealised gains/(losses) held by the Fund in equity is recorded in a separate reserve account and any amount remaining in this reserve account at the end of an accounting period (whether gain or loss) is included in the amount available for distribution to the unit holders.

3.7 Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Fund has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate of the obligation can be made. Provisions are regularly reviewed and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate.

3.8 Net Asset Value per Unit

The net asset value per unit as disclosed on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities is calculated by dividing the net assets of the Fund by the number of units in circulation at the year end.

3.9 Taxation

Provision for current taxation is based on taxable income at the current rates of taxation after taking into account tax credits and rebates available, if any.

The income of the Fund is exempt from income tax under clause 99 of Part I to the Second Schedule of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 subject to the condition that not less than 90 percent of its accounting income for the year, as reduced by capital gains, whether realised or unrealised, is distributed amongst the unit holders. Accordingly, the Fund has not recorded a tax liability in respect of income relating to the current year.

The Fund provides for deferred taxation using the balance sheet liability method on all major temporary differences between the amounts attributed to assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and amounts used for taxation purposes. In addition, the Fund also records deferred tax asset on unutilised tax losses to the extent that these will be available for set off against future taxable profit. Deferred tax assets are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

3.10 Preliminary Expenses and Floatation Costs

Preliminary expenses and floatation costs represent expenditure incurred prior to the commencement of operations of the Fund. These costs are being amortised over a period of five years commencing from 01 March 2002.

3.11 Offsetting of Financial Instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

3.12 Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities

Financial assets carried on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities include bank balances, receivable against Carry Over Transactions, investments in marketable securities 'Held for trading', investments in marketable securities 'Available for sale', dividend and profit receivable and certain other receivables.

Financial liabilities carried on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities include payable against purchase of investments, payable on redemption of units, payable to Arif Habib Investment Management Limited – Management Company, payable to Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited – Trustee and accrued expenses and other liabilities.

At the time of initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at cost, which is the fair value of the consideration given or received for it. Transaction costs are included in the initial measurement of all financial assets and financial liabilities except for transaction costs that may be incurred on disposal. All the financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised at the time when the Fund becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Any gain or loss on derecognition of the financial assets and financial liabilities is taken to income statement.

3.13 Revenue Recognition

- Gains / (losses) arising on sale of investments are included in the Income Statement on the date at which
 the transaction takes place.
- Unrealised gains / (losses) arising on revaluation of securities classified as 'Held for trading' are included in the Income Statement in the period in which they arise as disclosed in the note 3.2 to these financial statements.
- Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive the dividend is established.
- Income on reverse repurchase transactions, carry over transactions and bank deposits is recognised on a time proportionate basis.

3.14 Transactions with Connected Persons

Transactions between the Fund and its "connected persons", as defined in the NBFC Rules, are carried out on an arm's length basis. The relevant rates are determined in accordance with the "Comparable Uncontrolled Price Method".

Transactions with connected persons have been disclosed in note 15 to these financial statements.

3.15 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise of bank balances including term deposits.

11.1 Under the provisions of the NBFC Rules, a unit trust scheme is required to pay as annual fee to the SECP, an amount equal to one-tenth of one percent of the average annual net assets of the Fund.

12. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

During the year the Fund has entered into certain Carry Over Transactions with the counter parties in which the Fund earned COT premium amounting to Rs. 106,417 in excess of the limits specified by one of the Stock Exchanges. The management is of the view that the Fund is entitled to the full benefit of the rates at which the transactions were carried out as these were mutually agreed rates between the transacting parties.

18. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Fund is primarily a stock market fund, which invests in shares of listed companies. Investment in shares of companies carries a risk that is considered higher than that of investment in debt securities. Capital invested in the stock market could, in extreme circumstances, lose its entire value. However, studies show that diversification of the investment into a number of shares and industrial sectors with a reasonably longer-term investment horizon reduces the risk associated with investing in the stock market. The risk emanates from various factors that include, but are not limited to:

18.1 Market Risk

Market risk is the risk of volatility in share prices resulting from their dependence on market sentiments, speculative activities, supply and demand for shares and liquidity in the market. The volatility in share prices results in volatility in the NAV based price of the Fund. The value of investments may fluctuate due to change in business cycles affecting the business of the company in which the investment is made, change in business circumstances of the company, its business sector, industry and / or the economy in general.

The Management Company manages market risk by monitoring exposure on marketable securities by following the internal risk management policies and investment guidelines approved by the Investment Committee and regulations laid down by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan.

18.2 Credit Risk

Credit Risk Management

Credit risk arises from the inability of the relevant brokerage house or the counter party to fulfill their obligations. There is a possibility of default by participants or failure of the financial markets / stock exchanges, the depositories, the settlements or clearing system, etc.

The Fund's policy is to enter into financial contracts in accordance with the internal risk management policies and investment guidelines approved by the Investment Committee. In addition, the risk is managed through assignment of credit limits and by following strict credit evaluation criteria laid down by the management.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Concentration of credit risk exists when changes in economic or industry factors similarly affect groups of counterparties whose aggregate credit exposure is significant in relation to the Fund's total credit exposure. Financial assets subject to credit risk amount to Rs. 500 million (2004: Rs. 380 million). The Fund's portfolio of financial instruments is broadly diversified and transactions are entered into with diverse credit-worthy counterparties thereby mitigating any significant concentrations of credit risk.

18.3 Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Fund may encounter difficulty in raising funds to meet its obligations and commitments. The Management Company manages the liquidity risk by investing a major portion of the Fund's assets in highly liquid shares.

18.4 Market Rate of Return (MROR) Risk

MROR risk is the risk that the value of a financial instrument will fluctuate due to changes in the market interest rates. The Fund has minimal MROR exposure as it primarily invests in listed securities.

19. FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The fair value of investment in marketable securities is based on the closing market prices ruling at the day-end. The management is of the view that the fair market value of the remaining financial assets and liabilities are not significantly different from their carrying values since assets and liabilities are essentially short-term in nature.
