In view of the loss incurred the Directors regretfully recommend that dividend be omitted this year.

The financial results are not satisfactory mainly due to lower crushing, lower recovery of sugar and lower sale prices of sugar and molasses. Due to severe windstorm, a substantial portion of the sugarcane crop was destroyed and dislodged resulting in lower recovery of sugar and lower sugar production. The sugar industry continues to suffer from Government's decision of last year for allowing import of unlimited quantity of sugar resulting in drastic reduction in sugar prices.

# Statement of Compliance with the Code of Corporate Governance for the Year Ended 30 September, 2007.

This statement is being presented to comply with the Code of Corporate Governance contained in listing regulations of Karachi Stock Exchange and Lahore Stock Exchange for the purpose of establishing a frame work of good governance, whereby a listed company is managed in compliance with the best practices of corporate governance.

The Company has applied the principles contained in the Code in the following manner:

- The Company encourages representation of independent non-executive directors and directors representing minority interest in its Board of Directors. At present the Board includes five independent non-executive directors.
- The Directors have confirmed that none of them is serving as a director in more than ten listed companies, including this Company.
- All the directors of the Company are registered as taxpayers and none of them has
  defaulted in payment of any loan to a banking company, a DFI or and NBFI or, being a
  member of stock exchange, has been declared as defaulter by that stock exchange.
- No casual vacancy occured in the Board during the year.
- The Company has prepared a 'Statement of Ethics and Business Practices', which has been signed by all the directors and employees of the company.
- 6. The Board has developed a vision/mission statement, overall corporate strategy and significant policies of the Company. A compete record of particulars of significant policies alongwith the dates on which they were approved or amended has been maintained.
- 7. All the powers of the Board have been duly exercise and decision on material transactions, including appointment and determination of remuneration and terms and conditions of employment of the CEO and other executive directors, have been taken by the Board.
- 8. The meetings of the Board were presided over by the Chief Executive and, in his absence, by a director elected by the Board for this purpose and the board met atleast once in every quarter. Written notices of the Board meetings, along with agenda and working papers, were circulated at least seven days before the meetings. The minutes of the meetings were appropriately recorded and circulated.
- 9. The Board arranged necessary orientation courses for its directors during the year to apprise them of their duties and responsibilities.



- The Board has approved appointment of CFO, Company Secretary and Head of Internal Audit, including their remuneration and terms and conditions of employment, as determined by the CEO.
- 11. The directors' report for this year has been prepared in compliance with the requirements of the Code and fully describes the salient matters required to be disclosed.
- 12. The financial statements of the Company were duly endorsed by CEO and CFO before approval of the Board.
- 13. The directors, CEO and executives do not hold any interest in the shares of the company other than that disclosed in the pattern of shareholding.
- 14. The Company has complied with all the corporate and financial reporting requirements of the Code.
- 15. The Board has formed an audit committee. It comprises three members, and all of them are non-executive directors including the chairman of the committee.
- 16. The meetings of the audit committee were held at least once every quarter prior to approval of interim and final results of the Company and as required by the Code. The terms of reference of the committee have been formed and advised to the committee for compliance.
- 17. The Board has set-up an effective internal audit function manned by suitably qualified and experienced personnel who are conversant with the policies and procedures of the Company and are involved in the internal audit function on a full time basis.
- 18. The statutory auditors of the Company have confirmed that they have been given a satisfactory rating under the Quality Control Review Programme of partners of the firm, their spouses and minor children do not hold shares of the company and that the firm and all its partners are in compliance with International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) guidelines on code of ethics as adopted by Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan.
- 19. The statutory auditors or the persons associated with them have not been appointed to provide other services except in accordance with the listing regulations and the auditors have confirmed that they have observed IFAC guidelines in this regard.
- We confirm that all other material principles contained in the Code have been complied.

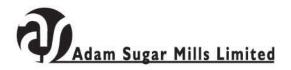
- in our opinion, proper books of accounts have been kept by the Company as required by the Companies Ordinance, 1984;

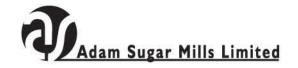

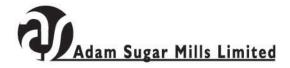

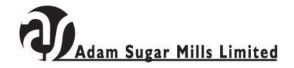

### Notes To The Financial Statements FOR THE YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2007

### 1. COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

Adam Sugar Mills Limited (the Company) was Incorporated in Pakistan as a public limited company. The shares of the Company are quoted on Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchanges. The Company is principally engaged in the Manufacturing and Sale of sugar.

### 2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan and the requirements of the Companies Ordinance, 1984. Approved accounting standards comprise of such International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as notified under the provisions of the Companies Ordinance, 1984. Wherever the requirements of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 or directives issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan differ with the requirements of these standards, the requirement of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 or the requirements of the said directives take precedence.

### 2.1. CORRECTION OF PRIOR PERIOD ERRORS

In prior year, deferred tax liability relating to revaluation surplus was not accounted for, accordingly revaluation surplus was not reduced. As a result deferred tax liability of Rs.140.68 million was not recognised in financial statements. In current year, the company recognizes accumulated effect of deferred tax liability related to surplus on revaluation in accordance with IAS 8 "Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors". This omission is corrected by restating the opening balance of retained earning, deferred tax liability, surplus on revaluation and related deferred tax charge of the prior year. Had the correction not been made, loss for current year would have been increased by Rs. 63.134 million and profit for year 2006 would have been increased by Rs. 33.92 million

### 2.2. Financial reporting and accounting standards not yet effective

In addition, interpretations in relation to certain International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) have been issued by the International Accounting Standards Board that are not yet effective.

The Company expects that the adaptation of the above standards, amendments and interpretations (except IAS 41, Agriculture, refer 2.1.1) will have no impact on the Company's' financial statements in the period of initial application.

2.2.1. Under IAS - 41 "Agriculture", a biological asset shall be measured on initial recognition and at each balance sheet date at its fair value less estimated point of sale costs. A gain or loss arising on initial recognition of a biological asset at fair value less estimate point of sale costs and from a change in fair value less estimated point of sale costs of a biological asset shall be included in profit or loss for the period in which it arises. The financial statements of the Company for the year ending September 30, 2008 are expected to be affected by the above referred requirement of IAS - 41, the amount thereof cannot be determined at this stage.



### 3 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in preparing these financial statements are as follows:

### 3.1 Basis of Preparation

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise disclosed

### 3.2. Critical accounting estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards, as applicable in Pakistan, requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about the carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgements made by management in the application of approved accounting standard as, applicable in Pakistan, that have significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material judgement in the next year are as follows:

### Property, plant, equipment and depreciation

The Company estimates the rate of depreciation of property and equipment. Further, the Company reviews the value of the assets for possible impairment on an annual basis. Any change in the estimates in future years might affect the carrying amounts of the respective items of property and equipment with a corresponding effect on the depreciation charge and impairment.



### Stock in trade and stores and spares

The Company reviews the net realizable value of stock-in-trade and stores and spares parts to assess any diminution in the respective carrying values. Net realizable values is estimated with reference to the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated cost necessary to make the sale.

### Trade debts and receivables

The Company reviews its receivables against any provision required for any doubtful balances on a on-going basis. The provision is made while taking into consideration expected recoveries, if any.

#### **Taxation**

In making the estimates for income taxes currently payable by the Company, the management looks at the current income tax law and the decisions of appellate authorities on certain issues in the past.

### Staff retirement benefits

Certain actuarial assumptions have been adopted as disclosed in the relevant note to the financial statements for valuation of present value of defined benefit obligations. Any changes in these assumptions in future years might affect gains and losses in those years.

### 3.3 Property, plant and equipment

### Owned

These are stated at cost or revalued amount less depreciation and impairment except for freehold and lease hold lands which are stated at revalued amounts and historical cost respectively.

Depreciation is charged to income using the reducing balance method at the rates specified in the relevant note. Depreciation on additions is charged from the month in which the asset is put to use and on disposals up to the month the asset in use.

Maintenance and normal repairs are charged to income as and when incurred while major improvements, if any, are capitalized. Gains and losses on disposal of assets are included in the profit and loss account.

The company assess at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that a fixed asset may be impaired. If such indication exist, the carrying amounts of such assets are reviewed to assess whether they are recorded in excess of their recoverable amount. Where carrying amounts exceed the estimated recoverable amount, assets are written down to the recoverable amount.

### Leased

The Company recognizes fixed assets acquired under finance lease by recording the asset and the related liability at the amounts which are determined on the basis of discounted value of minimum lease payments, which is the fair value of the asset.

Finance cost are allocated to the accounting period in a manner so as to provide a constant periodic rate of charge on the outstanding liability. Depreciation is charged to income applying the same basis as for owned assets.

### 3.4 Capital work in progress

These are stated at cost less impairment, if any, and represent expenditure on fixed assets in the course of construction and installation. Transfers are made to relevant fixed asset category as and when assets are available for their intended use.

### 3.5 Stores and spares

These are valued at moving average cost basis. Provision is made for items considered obsolete and slow moving. Items in transit are valued at cost comprising invoice price and other charges paid thereon.

### 3.6 Stock in trade

These are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value.
